



### A WINNING INVESTMENT FOR IDAHO STATEWIDE ECONOMIC IMPACT

- \$1.1 billion in total impact 1.9 percent of GSP
- Students: enhanced lifetime earnings
- Taxpayers: increased tax returns, reduced demand for social service
- Businesses: new economic activity, increased productivity, greater output
- Social benefits: health, safety, employment



# ECONOMIC IMPACT STUDY IMPACT FOR STUDENTS

#### RETURN ON INVESTMENT

- Significant lifetime earnings differential
- \$3.30 return for every \$1 invested
