

Abraham Lincoln was self-educated, went to college and became a bright lawyer. As a young lawyer and politician Lincoln earned the name Honest Abe.



Lincoln married Mary Todd and had four sons. He was a devoted father and husband.

In 1832, Abraham Lincoln became the 16th President of the United States. During Lincoln's presidency the North and the South did not agree on slavery. The North was opposed to slavery, and the South wanted to keep slavery. The South left the Union, starting the Civil War.

Lincoln led the Union during a time of turmoil in the United States. On January 1, 1863, Lincoln issued the Emancipation Proclamation, abolishing slavery. The Civil War continued for a few more years before the Union won and unity was restored for our country.





On a chilly spring night, President Lincoln attended a concert at the Fords Theater in Washington D.C. He was **assassinated** on April 15, 1865.



Lincoln's legacy lives on through a memorial temple dedicated to him in Washington D.C. His honesty, patience, and leadership during his lifetime had a lasting impact on the United States of America.

Glossary

Abolitionist: Someone who wanted to end slavery. Advocated and supported ending slavery while it was still common practice in the United States.

<u>Civil War</u>: The war fought in the United States between northern (Union) and southern (Confederate) states in 1861 to 1865. The Confederacy tried to establish itself as a separate nation.

Emancipation Proclamation: A presidential order on January 1, 1863 issued to free all slaves in the United States

<u>Rural</u>: The countryside, not the town; remote area.

<u>Assassinated/Assassination</u>: To kill/murder an important person - usually for political reasons.
