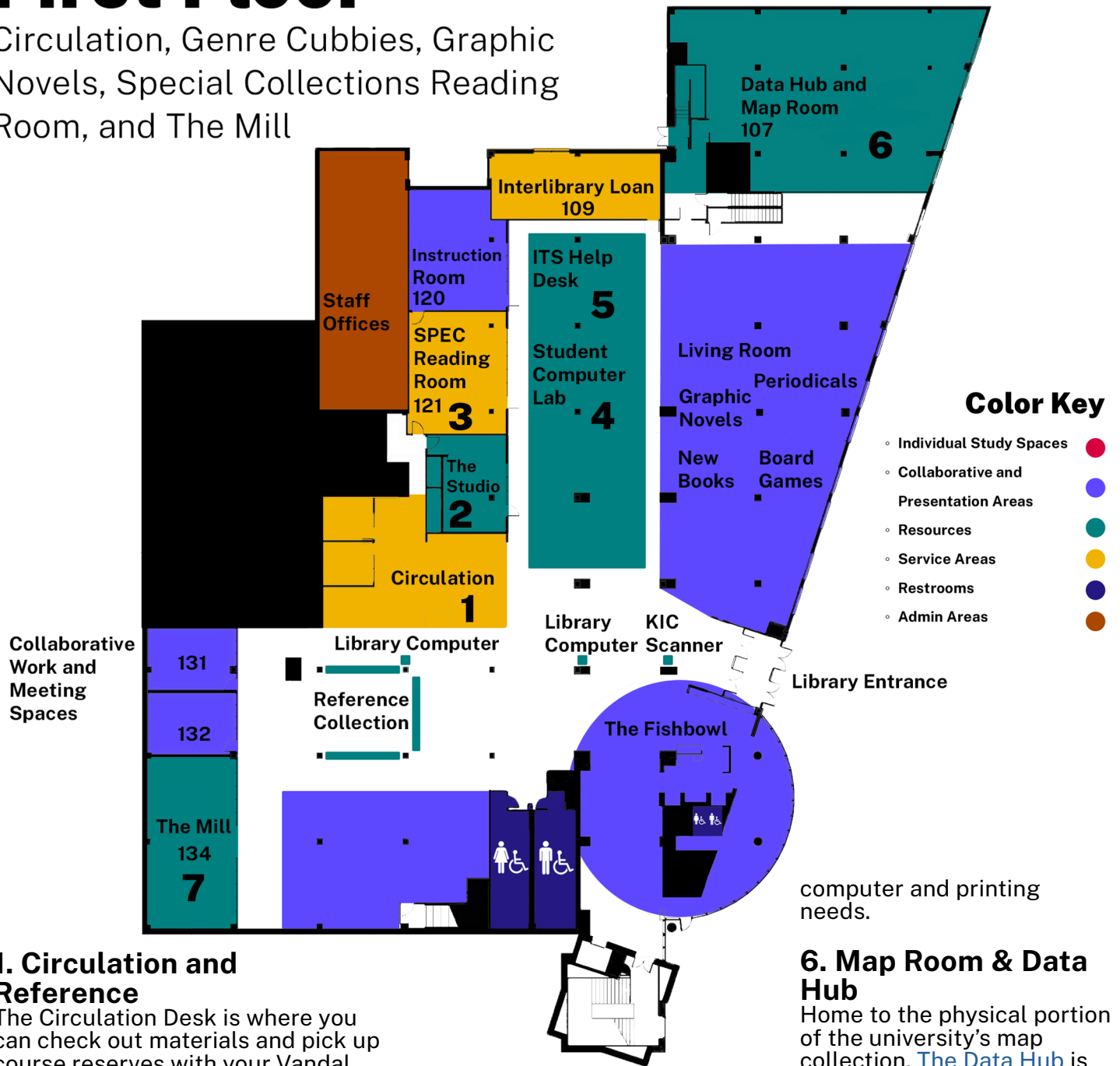


First Floor

1. Circulation and Reference

The Circulation Desk is where you can check out materials and pick up course reserves with your Vandal ID.

6. Map Room & Data Hub

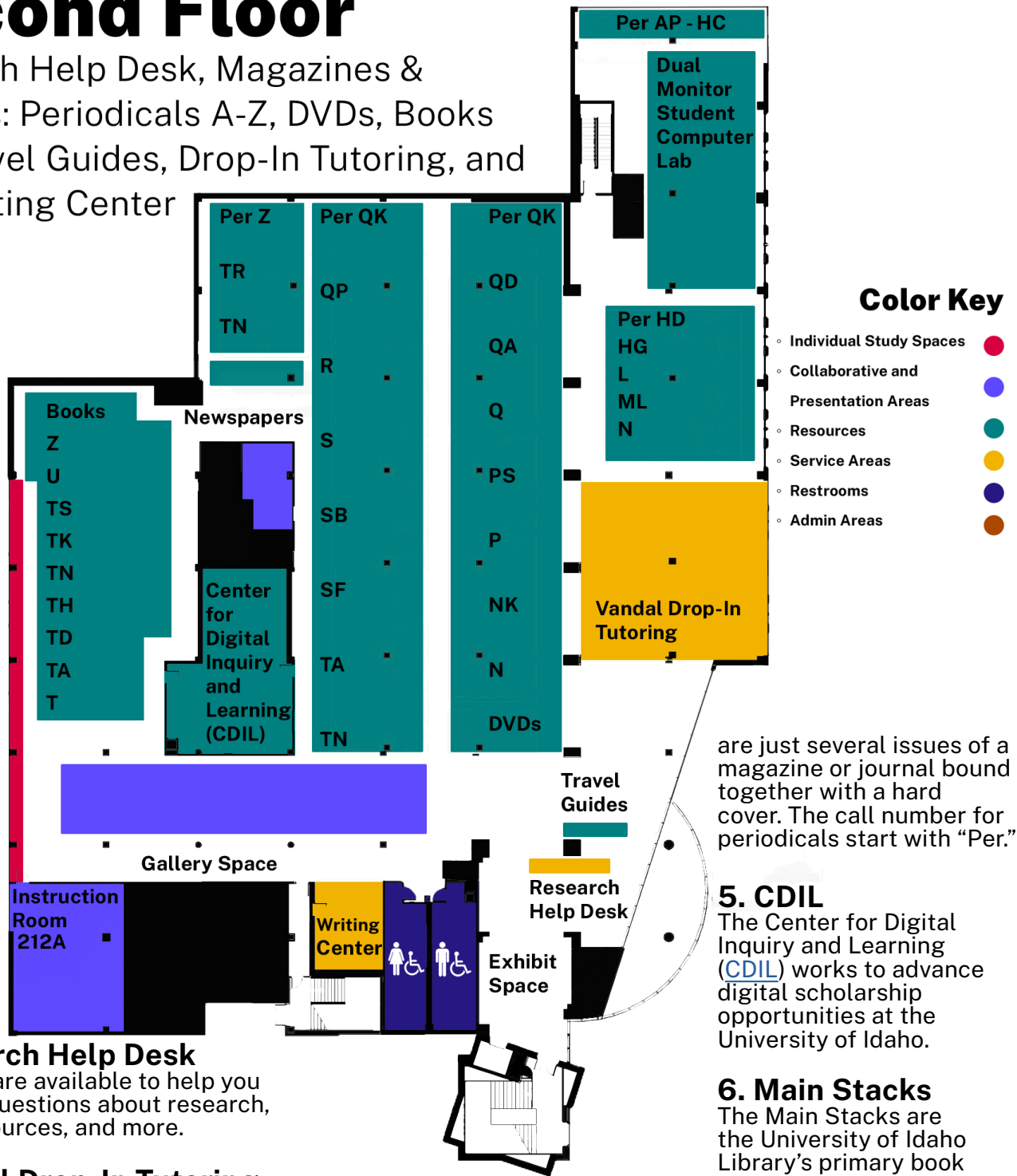

The Center for Digital Inquiry and Learning ([CDIL](#)) works to advance digital scholarship opportunities at the University of Idaho.

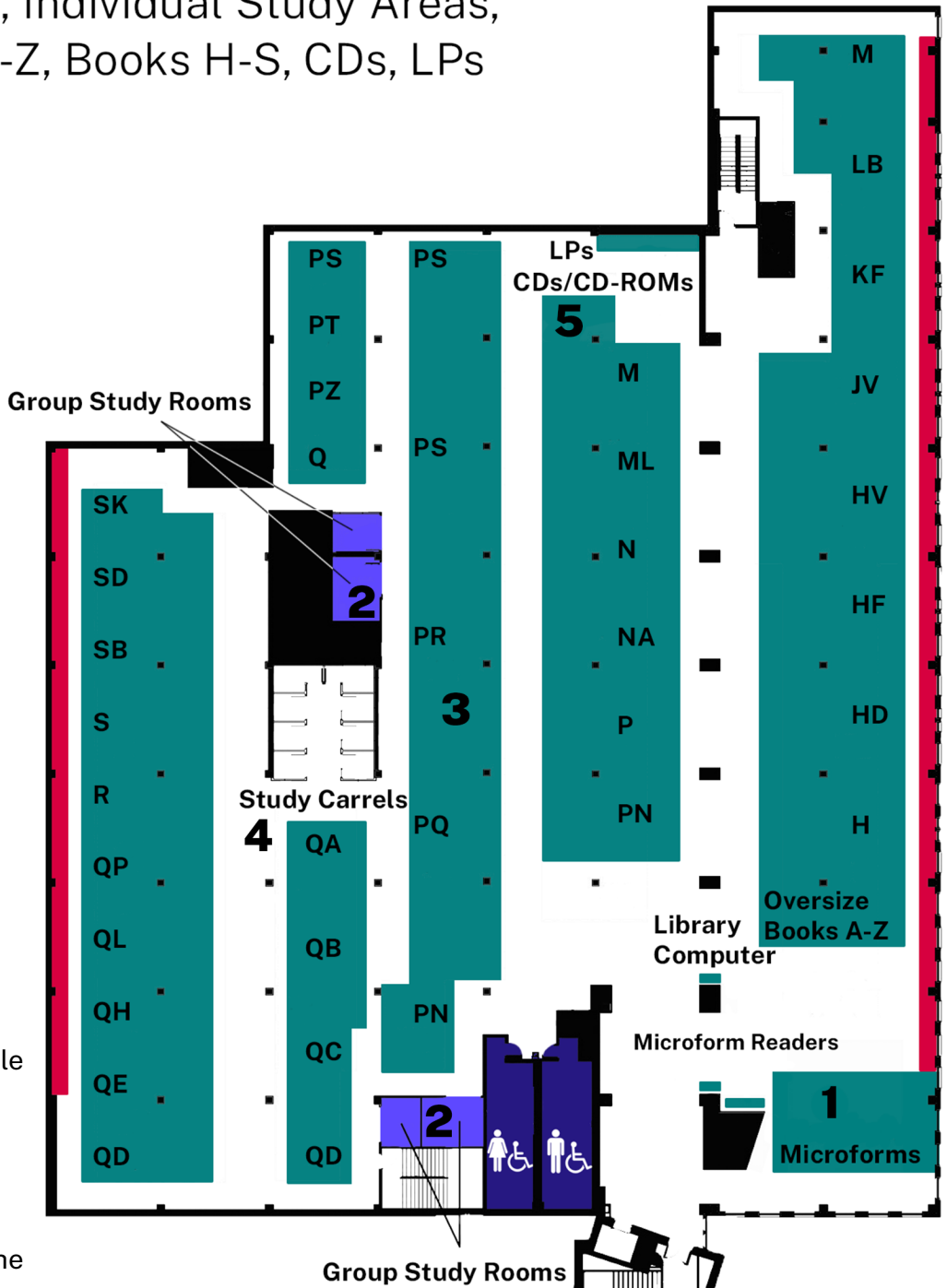
6. Main Stacks

5. CDs & LPs

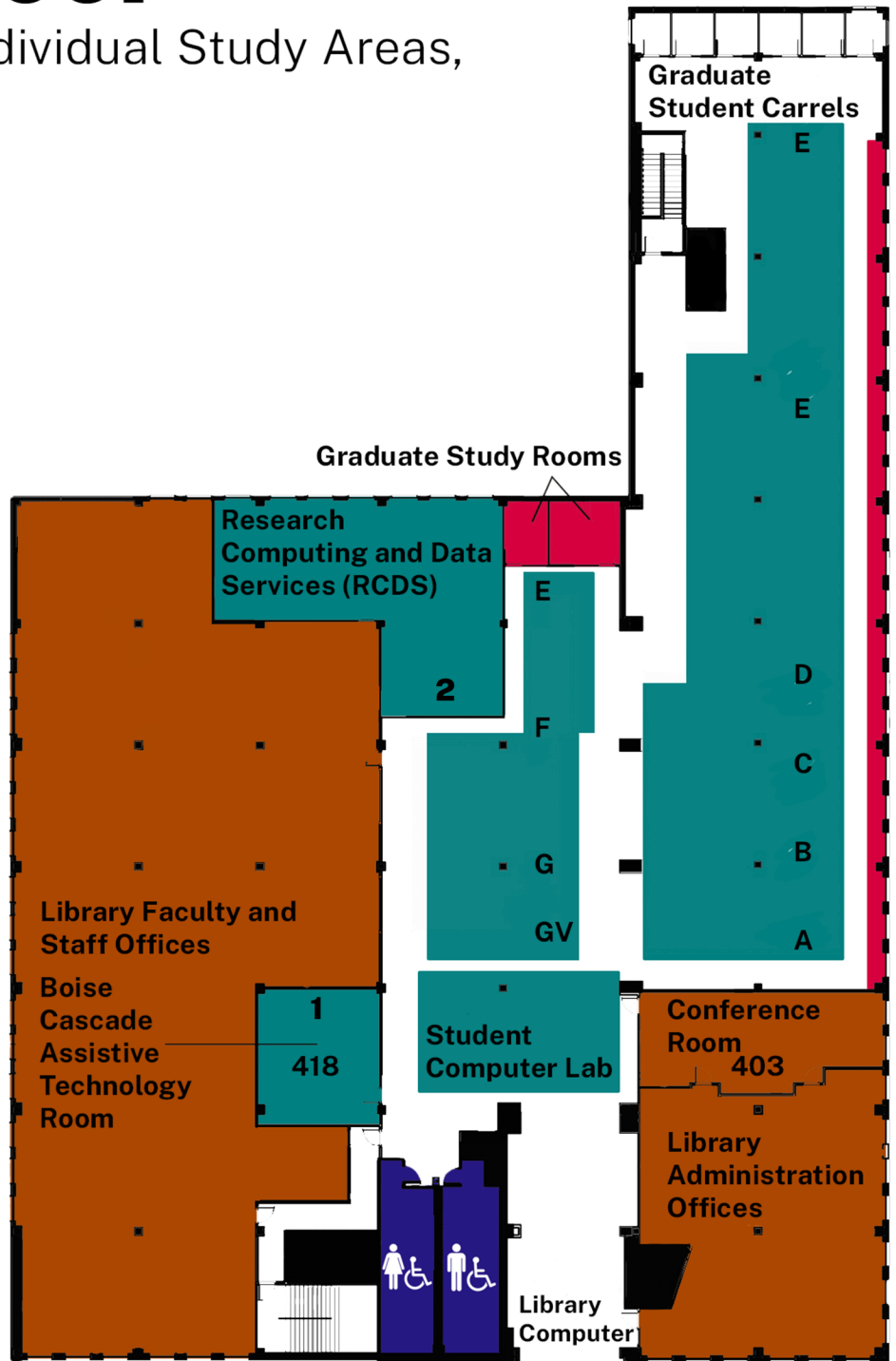
The Library has a collection of CDs and LPs available for check out.
