



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WHAT IS A PRIMARY SOURCE?

primary source


n.

Material that contains firsthand accounts of events and that was created contemporaneous to those events or later recalled by an eyewitness (Society of American Archivists)



n.

A work that is not based on direct observation of or evidence directly associated with the subject, but instead relies on sources of information; A work commenting on another work (primary sources), such as reviews, criticism, and commentaries (Society of American Archivists)

- Business records

WHY USE PRIMARY SOURCES?

- I Spark curiosity or engagement with a novel medium the "cool factor"
- I Teach critical thinking skills, evidence analysis, and argument development
- Illustrate how scholarship is made up of source material, passed through a lens of interpretation





STRATEGIES FOR USING PRIMARY SOURCES

- Analyzing individual primary sources
 - SOAPSTonE (Speaker, Occasion, Audience, Purpose, Subject, Tone, and Evidence)
 - See, Think, Wonder
 - Surprising, Interesting, Troubling
- Use a collection of primary sources to answer a question or form an argument
 - What do a group of primary sources tell them about an event or era?
 - What evidence seems to be missing?
- Compare a secondary source interpretation to primary sources referenced therein
 - Consider what choices the secondary source author made in their interpretation

Special Collections and Archives

Located in Library basement, Reading Room on first floor; specialization in regional and university history, plus jazz history, science fiction, and environment

Digital Collections (<u>lib.uidaho.edu/digital</u>)

Online access to groups of historic document, photos, and other records, largely drawn from university archive
