Introduction to citation managers

- “Citation managers are tools that enable you to store and organize references to journal articles, websites, and any other sources you are using for projects. They integrate with word processors such as Microsoft Word so that you can insert correctly formatted citations directly into your documents while you're writing, and generate a formatted bibliography at the end” ([University of Maryland, 2022](#))

Introduction to citation managers (2)

- Zotero: Pros
 - Completely free; all of the code is open source software and [hosted on GitHub](#)
 - Can sync data across multiple devices
 - Easy to learn and use
 - Collaborative group libraries
 - Add sources in one-click using the Zotero connector
 - Plug-ins for Microsoft Word, Google Docs, and LibreOffice
 - Edit PDFs in desktop app
 - Useful online documentation

Introduction to citation managers (3)

- Zotero: Cons
 - Requires desktop/laptop application to use all of the features
 - Limited free cloud storage (only 300 MB)
 - No first-party mobile app for Android

Introduction to citation managers (4)

- Zotero terminology
 - Library: The main folder where all references are stored
 - Collections: Subfolders with specific references
 - Items: Individual references
 - Connector: A browser extension that helps you create an item in Zotero
